

Notice of Appointment

Kenneth M. Cox, Au.D., M.P.H., CCC-A has been appointed as to serve as the Associate Dean of the Waldron College of Health and Human Services at Radford University (RU). Dr. Cox assumes the position after being the Chairman for the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at RU for the past two and a half years. Ken attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill on a football scholarship and obtained his Bachelor or Arts in Psychology. He received his Master of Arts in Audiology from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and his Doctor of Audiology (Au.D.) degree from the University of Florida. He also holds a Master of Public Health in Public Health Leadership from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In addition, Dr. Cox has graduate training in clinical research from The Johns Hopkins University Schools of Medicine and Public Health. Prior to joining the faculty at Radford University, Dr. Cox was an Assistant Professor and Research Coordinator for Audiology at The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, where he participated in a wide variety of clinical and research activities, including clinical trials on implantable hearing aids. His current research interests include electrophysiology in children with autism and aural rehabilitation. Dr. Cox was one of the first Au.D. trained Audiologists to become Chairman of an ASHA accredited program in Communication Sciences and Disorders.
